

Kim's Game (Memory)

We used to play this as a party game, using objects on a tray. It's an excellent game for developing memory (and language processing- word recall) skills.



The traditional game - One person arranges a variety of objects on a tray, and shows it to the players for one or two minutes. Then the tray is covered and each player writes down all the objects he/she can remember.

Kim's "Flash Cards" game- use word cards instead of objects. Place five or more face up on the table or floor, and give your player/s a minute or so to remember them. Then gather them up. The player/s must say the words.

Variations of Kim's Flash Cards game -

- Use more or fewer cards
- Write the cards with different colours
- Let the players read the words out aloud before they are covered
- for "spelling words", ask the players to write the words
- play "What's missing?" - instead of gathering up all the cards, have the players turn away while you re-arrange the cards, removing one as you do so. Then the players turn back and work out which card is missing.
